Welcome back to a new academic year! In Willow class we have made a great start to the term and have lots to look forward to. Our newsletter outlines our learning for this term. If you would like any further information, please ask.

English	In English we will be retelling a fairy tale (The True Story of the Three Little Pigs). We		
Ü	will then be writing a story with a historical setting (Stone Age Boy).		
	In GPS we will be focusing on using a range of conjunctions, adverbs, prepositions,		
	inverted commas, verbs, pronouns and fronted adverbials.		
Maths	In maths we follow the White Rose scheme. This half term we will be looking at place		
	value and addition and subtraction. We will also be spending time learning and		
	practicing our times tables using TT Rockstars and Club Maths. More details and

Science	In science we will be trying to find an answer to the question- can materials change		
	state? To do this we will be having lessons and conducting investigations into changing		
	states of matter.		
History	In History we are learning all about the Stone Age, Iron Age and Bronze Age. We will be		
-	trying to decide which period of time we would have preferred to live in.		
Art	In Art we are creating our own prehistoric paintings linked with our learning about the		
	Stone Age.		
French	In French we are learning greetings and simple introductions.		
RE	In RE we are looking at how all religions are equal and what makes some texts sacred.		
Music	In music we will be performing songs in tune with expression and appropriate pitch.		
PSHE	In PSHE we will be learning about families and our relationships with others.		
Computing	In computing we will be learning about data and data logging		
PE	In PE we will be focusing on the fundamentals of movement. We will also be swimming!		

Home learning

Children are expected to complete 2 assignments per week on Reading Plus. They are also expected to practice the spellings in their books and complete the task set for them on Spelling Shed. Finally, children **must** be practicing their times tables at home. Please ensure your child is playing on TTRockstars at least 3 times a week, as well as practicing any mistakes on their weekly club maths sheets.
