Our Learning



In Brambles this week, the children have been making Stick Friends and making maps of the Forest School area. The children have also been consolidating their knowledge of digraphs this week in phonics, playing phonics bingo!

In their Gymnastics lessons, Oak Class have been learning all about balances on different points. The Year 2 pupils have been making forest friends with clay in Forest School and re-writing the story of Little Red Reading Hood. They have also been using a range of colours and media to create their own pieces of art in class.

Willow Class have been studying Roald Dahl's story The BFG (Big Friendly Giant). They have been creating their own pieces of writing around 'Dream Jars' using a range of adventurous vocabulary, including ellipses. In French, the children have been learning the vocabulary for classroom objects and practising this by playing card matching games.

Elm Class have been learning about forces such as gravity and air resistance in Science. They have been conducting a scientific enquiry to see if all objects fall at the same rate. In Art Lessons, the children have been learning to use watercolour paints to create a colour wash and in RE they have been learning more about Judaism.







In Brambles class this week, we have been learning about maps and what they tell us.


































Trips and Experiences



On Wednesday last week, Oak Class visited Westacre Middle School to join in with the Gymnastics Festival.



This week, Elm Class visited RAF Cosford Museum as part of the current History topic, World War II. It was wonderful for the children to be able see History brought to life!






















Portacabin Rebuild Project



We are delighted to announce, that the Ombersley Conservation Trust have agreed to donate £15,000 towards the school's contribution for the new build! This is fantastic news and has taken some pressure of the school's central budget.

In addition to this, the National Grid have met with the third party land owner this week regarding the new transformer and they will now be obtaining the wayleave signing. This means that they now have permission to go ahead with the works to ensure that we have a three phase electricity supply. We don't yet know when this will be completed, but we will keep you posted.

We have been obtaining quotes for our sensory garden and are hoping to get the block paving sorted out fairly soon.

We are also in the process of arranging a replacement Summer House building for the Bird Hide in our Forest School Area after this fell down a couple of weeks ago.
