Christmas Cards outside the school office from Monday.


Children can post Christmas cards for their friends in school up until **Thursday**

Programme is back for winter. Eligible children and families are invited to sign up to the HAF Programme. This year the

programme includes family days out, pantomime tickets, activity clubs, events and more!

The **HAF** programme, funded by the Department for Education (DfE):

- Offers fully funded holiday activity places, events and family passes across Worcestershire for eligible children and young people.
- Allows children, young people and their families to access up to 4 funded activity places, access funded family passes, tickets to events and more.

Who is eligible?
Worcestershire Children and
Young people aged 5-16:

- Who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals (FSM).
- Limited places are available to other groups of children and young people who are considered financially or otherwise vulnerable.

Online Safety

KS 2 parents will have seen the 'Wake up Wednesday' resources that Miss Unitt has been sending out. It is vital that parents keep up to date with online safety issues, because our children will always be one step ahead! This month we have drawn attention to the dangers of Snapchat which will reveal a child's location, has disappearing messages which makes it difficult for parents to monitor and can be set to have locked folders, which parents won't be able to see or access. The guidance age is 13+ and research shows that 65% of young users have received threatening messages encouraging them to share indecent images or threatening to share more widely images that have been posted.
