This week our amazing Reception and Key Stage 1 children performed a beautiful 'Wriggly Nativity.' It was delightful and the children did such a great job!



Governor Vacancies



Are you enthusiastic about Education?

Do you have some time to spare?

If so, then you may be just the person we need!

At Sytchampton Endowed Primary School we are looking for a co-opted governor to join our governing body. As a governor you will be a volunteer who makes a vital contribution to the success of the school.

School governors have three main roles.

Governors ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

The governing body helps to set long-terms plans for the school, decide where improvements need to be made and how to make them.

Governors hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and the effective and efficient performance management of staff.

The governing body looks at the quality of education being offered and ensures the head is doing everything possible to improve results.

Governors oversee the financial performance of the school and make sure its money is well spent.

Governors examine budgets and spending proposals to monitor whether the school is getting value for money and ensure the money is spent in the right areas.

This role may be particularly of interest if you have skills in finance/accounting, human resources, data or education but we invite applications from anyone who is interested in helping the school be the best it can be. Full training is available and governors are encouraged to attend regular training sessions, either in person or online.

We are looking for someone who can attend approximately three full governing body meetings per year and around three to six committee meetings per year (dependant on committee). Full governing body meetings are held in school, usually on Thursday evenings and committee meetings are held online on either Wednesday or Thursday evenings (dependant on committee) from around 6.30pm to 8.00pm. Governors also spend time in school during the day (around two visits per term).

You must be 18 or over to apply and all governors must have Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks. If you would like to find out more please email:

Portacabin Rebuild Project



It has been wonderful to see our Key Stage 2 pupils in their new classrooms over the past couple of weeks! The temporary heating is working well and we are now able to access the cloakrooms. The toilets are now complete but we are awaiting the treatment of the water and lagging of some pipework before we can use them.

This week, we have installed blinds across all of the windows and we are planning a library/breakout space for the main entrance way. We are now just awaiting some quotes for this work before going ahead and ordering what we need.

After Christmas, the builders will complete the remaining tarmac and we are hoping for the heat pump to be up and running (although we still don't have a date for the electricity supply work from Western Power!).

We won't be able to complete the work on re-seeding the field and areas around the building until the weather picks up a little.

So, we are hoping to plan a big 'Official Opening' at some point in the new year so that everyone can come and have a look at our wonderful new building!

The Autumn term will end with our annual Carol Concert at 1.30pm with school closing for the holidays at 2.30pm (no WAC available).


