

<b>allocate</b>	To distribute resources or duties for a particular purpose.
<b>borrow</b>	To take something, such as money, with an intention to give it back.
<b>commitment</b>	A promise to do something or behave in a certain way.
<b>expenditure</b>	Money that is spent on something.
<b>impact</b>	The effect or influence that an action or event has on something or someone.
<b>interest</b>	Something you enjoy doing or learning about.
<b>loan</b>	Money that is borrowed and needs to be paid back, often with interest.
<b>prioritise</b>	To order the importance of things.
<b>risk</b>	A chance that something bad or unpleasant will happen.
<b>stretch</b>	To make something go as far as possible, such as money or resources.
