

Oak Class (Year 1/2) Curriculum Newsletter

Autumn Term 1 2024

Welcome to Oak class! We hope you all had an enjoyable and relaxing summer holiday! We have an exciting term planned and we have already been very busy. Our newsletter will outline our learning for this half term. If you want any further information, please ask,

Science: Living things, including humans We will be learning about what living things need to survive, how to keep healthy and simple life cycles.

History: What is History? We will be creating simple timelines and finding out how we can find out about the past.

Computing: Data handling We will be sorting, classifying, and recording data using a range of different methods.

Music: Perform We will be making and controlling sounds with our voice and with instruments and we are learning songs linked to Traditional Tales.

PSHE: Families and relationships We will be looking at identifying the importance of families, friendships, relationships and caring for others.

RE: Why do we need to give thanks? We will be learning how different religions express their thanks in diverse ways, including through music and festivals like Harvest.

PE: Fundamentals and Ball Skills We will be developing our fundamental movement skills and ball skills.

Art: Sculpture and 3D art. We will be experimenting with clay and making clay houses.

<u>English</u>

This half term we are focusing on narrative. We will be reading lots of different traditional tales. We are using the story of Little Red Riding Hood to inspire us in our English lessons. Our main focus, at the moment, is basic punctuation, such as; capital letters and full stops. Every morning, we are starting our day with handwriting to make sure we work on our letter formation. This is then



followed by phonics and spelling lessons. We have guided reading sessions throughout the week too. We also have a class read book, which is read at the end of every day.

<u>Maths</u>

In maths, we will be starting by focussing on place value of numbers up to 20. We will then be moving on to addition and subtraction within 20.

Reading At Home

Reading takes place in a variety of forms. Children will have phonics, spelling, grammar and guided reading lessons.

Children will come home with a phonics book, which they should be able to read fluently, and a 'love for reading' book which is linked to a colour reading band. Phonics books are changed every Monday and Wednesday, we ask children to change their 'love for reading' book whenever they need to.

When reading and sharing a book at home with your child, please try to ask some comprehension questions to ensure they understand what they are reading.

A note on homework:



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Children should be reading daily. They will also be sent home a sheet that contains spellings and maths test for each week. These will be sent home on Friday 20th September, and the first test will be Friday 27th September. Spellings are added to Spelling Shed for you to practise each week.
