
Spring Term Round Up

Wonderful Writing






Willow Class wrote some reports about deforestation





Oak Class have been retelling the story of 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson






We are so impressed with the emerging writing from our Brambles Class.

Remarkable Reading


