Our Learning



In Forest School this week, Brambles made the most of the windy weather and made kites which they flew on the field! In class, they have been learning about Chinese New Year and reading 'We Are Going On a Bear Hunt!' They have also been learning about Vincent Van Gough and re-creating his artwork.

In Oak Class, Year 1 are now taking part in Forest School every Friday. The children go out in all weathers, and despite the wet ground they had a wonderful time exploring! They have also been learning about Chinese New Year in RE and have enjoyed doing Yoga in PE lessons.

In Computing lessons, Willow Class the children have been creating stop motion animations inspired by chicken run and Morph! Barney even used stop frame to demonstrate his understanding of how we hear sound. He has showed how molecules vibrate and travel through the inner ear to the brain via the auditory nerve. In Art, the children in Willow have been studying the work of Barbara Hepworth, exploring 3D shape and her use of space within sculpture.

In Elm Class, the children have been learning about different forces in Science and conducting Scientific Enquiries. They have also been creating poetry and making mixed media portraits in Art lessons.

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





















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Trips and Experiences

In Nurture Club this week, the children played with bubbles, as this can be a great way to calm and reregulate.



































World Book Day

This year, World Book Day takes place on Thursday 7th March and we hope you'll join us to celebrate our World Book Day. The theme for this year's world book day is 'Read your Way!

Every year on World Book Day, we are overwhelmed by the enthusiasm of our school community. We are however aware of the cost of living and do not want our celebrations to be an additional burden. Therefore, as the theme is 'Read your Way' we would like the children to come into school dressed in an outfit which they would feel comfortable reading in- this may be their pyjamas. The choice is yours.



We are running a competition for you to take part in before the day: **create a potato character from your favourite book**. We hope that you will bring in your potato character, along with your favourite book on the day and we will admire these in the assembly at the end of the day. Each class will be given

time to show their class-based creations/activities of the day and their potatoes may be used for storytelling during the day. You can decorate your spud with: paint, wool and other pieces of material.
